The Master of Health Sciences degree in Clinical Mental Health Counseling program seeks:




Practicum & Internship

- Students take what they have learned from coursework and incorporate it into practice by counseling clients in real- world settings.
- Settings include: schools, hospitals, mental health facilities, rehabilitation clinics, private practices, universities, prisons, state and local agencies.
- Background check & drug testing
- Fieldwork placement is required for graduation.
 - Practicum: minimum 100 hours, 40 direct
 - Internship I & II: minimum 600 hours, 240 direct






