28		MISSION OF THE ASSEMBLY	
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30	Section 1.	The mission of the Assembly is to promote communication between Faculty and Administration,	
31		providing a formal mechanism for input into academic processes.	
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34		ARTICLE III.	
35		PURPOSE OF THE ASSEMBLY	
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37	Section 1.	To provide a means of communication between the faculty, Dean of the SAHP, Faculty Senate,	
38		Administration, Staff, and the Chancellor of LSUHSC-NO.	
39		A. The Assembly , subject to the powers vested in the Dean of the SAHP, shall:	
40		i. consider and make recommendations concerning matters of general interest to	
41		faculty;	
42		ii. review and approve all changes in existing policies or the establishment of new	
43		policies relating to matters of general SAHP interest when these policies are brought	
44		to the Assembly for consideration by its members, the Dean of the SAHP, the Senate,	
45		Chancellor of LSUHSC-NO, and the LSU system President;	
46		iii. consider and make recommendations on any matters referred to it by its members, the	
47 48		Dean of the SAHP, the Senate, and the Chancellor of LSUHSCNO, and the LSU system President	
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51		B. Delegates shall serve as a representative voice of the Assembly . Any recognized group within	
52		the SAHP community shall possess the privilege of presenting suggestions to the Delegates .	

Section 2.	To accept and share responsibility with administration and students in all efforts to improve the stature and to accomplish the mission of the SAHP, LSUHSC-NO.			
Section 3.	To communicate with the SAHP departments and faculty, as well as the other schools and faculties within LSUHSC.			
Section 4.	To communicate with the faculty assemblies of other colleges and universities.			
Section 5.	To declare and support the principle of academic freedom for all faculty.			
Section 6.	To initiate and conduct activities that will foster the continuation and development of SAHP programs.			
ARTICLE IV. AUTHORITY				
Section 1.	The Assembly may hear, consider, and advise the Dean of the SAHP LSUHSC-NO and the administration on matters of general concern to faculty. The Assembly may request the Dean of the SAHP to furnish appropriate information or documentation related to the specific matter of concern.			
ARTICLE V. MEMBERSHIP OF THE FACULTY ASSEMBLY MEMBERSHIP AND TERM OF OFFICE OF THE DELEGATES				
Section 1.	Eligibility. Members of the Assembly include full-time and part-time faculty members (40% or greater), with academic rank of Instructor or above from all SAHP departments and all SAHP administrators with faculty appointments.			
Section 2.	Faculty Assembly Delegates include members of the Assembly elected as representatives in accordance with the Bylaws.			
Section 3.	The term of office of a Delegate shall be three academic years, commencing at the first delegate meeting following their election. Delegates are eligible to serve no more than two consecutive terms.			
ARTICLE VI. FACULTY ASSEMBLY AND DELEGATE MEETINGS				
Section 1.	The Assembly shall meet a minimum of two times each academic year. These two meetings shall be called the SAHP Fall and Spring General Faculty Meetings. Meetings of the Assembly are open to all faculty, including part-time and gratis faculty, and administrators without academic rank.			
Section 2.	The Delegates shall meet in regular monthly sessions. Special meetings of the Delegates may be called as stipulated in the Bylaws. Meetings of the delegates are open to all faculty, including part-time and gratis faculty, and administrators without academic rank.			
Section 3.	Voting Privileges. Only members of the Assembly are eligible to vote during general meetings of the Assembly and only Delegates are eligible to vote during delegate meetings.
