FACULTY ASSEMBLY CONSTITUTION

Preamble

The faculty of the School of Allied Health Professions (SAHP), Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center in New Orleans (LSUHSC-NO), within applicable laws and policies of the Dean of the SAHP, Chancellor of the LSUHSC-NO, the President of the LSU System, the Board of Supervisors and the Board of Regents of LSU, do hereby effect through this Constitution the Faculty Assembly of the LSUHSC-NO.

**ARTICLE I.
NAME**

Section 1. This organization shall be known as the Faculty Assembly of the SAHP, LSUHSC-NO, hereinafter referred to as the **Assembly**.

Section 2. The term **Delegate** shall refer to the members of the **Assembly** elected as representatives in accordance with the Bylaws.

**ARTICLE II.
MISSION OF THE ASSEMBLY**

Section 1. The mission of the **Assembly** is to promote communication between Faculty and Administration, providing a formal mechanism for input into academic processes.

**ARTICLE III.
PURPOSE OF THE ASSEMBLY**

Section 1. To provide a means of communication between the faculty, Dean of SAHP, Faculty Senate, Administration, Staff, and the Chancellor of LSUHSC-NO.

A. The **Assembly**, subject to the powers vested in the Dean of SAHP, shall:

- i. consider and make recommendations concerning matters of general interest to faculty;
- ii. review and approve all changes in existing policies or the establishment of new policies relating to matters of general SAHP interest when these policies are brought to the **Assembly** for consideration by its members, the Dean of SAHP, the Senate, Chancellor of LSUHSC-NO, and the LSU system President;
- iii. consider and make recommendations on any matters referred to it by its members, the Dean of SAHP, the Senate, and the Chancellor of LSUHSC-NO, and the LSU system President

50 B. **Delegates** shall serve as a representative voice of the **Assembly**. Any recognized
51 group within the SAHP community shall possess the privilege of presenting
52 suggestions to the **Delegates**.
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54 **Section 2.** To accept and share responsibility with administration and students in all efforts to
55 improve the stature and to accomplish the mission of the SAHP, LSUHSC-NO.
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57 **Section 3.** To communicate with the SAHP departments and faculty, as well as the other
58 schools and faculties within LSUHSC.
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60 **Section 4.** To communicate with the faculty assemblies of other colleges and universities.
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62 **Section 5.** To declare and support the principle of academic freedom for all faculty.
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64 **Section 6.** To initiate and conduct activities that will foster the continuation and development of
65 SAHP programs.
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68 **ARTICLE IV.**
69 **AUTHORITY**
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71 **Section 1.** The **Assembly** may hear, consider, and advise the Dean of the SAHP LSUHSC-NO
72 and the administration on matters of general concern to faculty. The **Assembly** may
73 request the Dean of SAHP to furnish appropriate information or documentation
74 related to the specific matter of concern.
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77 **ARTICLE V.**
78 **MEMBERSHIP OF THE FACULTY ASSEMBLY**
79 **MEMBERSHIP AND TERM OF OFFICE OF THE DELEGATES**
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81 **Section 1.** **Eligibility.** Members of the **Assembly** include full-time faculty members (75% or greater),
82 with academic rank of Instructor or above from all SAHP departments and all SAHP
83 administrators with faculty appointments.
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85 **Section 2.** Faculty Assembly **Delegates** include members of the **Assembly** elected as representatives
86 in accordance with the Bylaws.
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88 **Section 3.** The term of office of a **Delegate** shall be three academic years, commencing at the first
89 delegate meeting following his/her election. Delegates are eligible to serve no more than
90 two consecutive terms.
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93 **ARTICLE VI.**
94 **FACULTY ASSEMBLY AND DELEGATE MEETINGS**
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96 **Section 1.** The **Assembly** shall meet a minimum of two times each academic year. These two
97 meetings shall be called the SAHP Fall and Spring General Faculty Meetings. Meetings of

98 the **Assembly** are open to all faculty, including part-time and gratis faculty, and
99 administrators without academic rank.

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101 **Section 2.** The **Delegates** shall meet in regular monthly sessions. Special meetings of the **Delegates**
102 may be called as stipulated in the Bylaws. Meetings of the delegates are open to all
103 faculty, including part-time and gratis faculty, and administrators without academic rank.

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105 **Section 3.** **Voting Privileges.** Only members of the **Assembly** are eligible to vote during general
106 meetings of the **Assembly** and only **Delegates** are eligible to vote during delegate
107 meetings.

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109 **ARTICLE VII.**
110 **OFFICERS**

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112 **Section 1.** Officers of the **Assembly** shall be **Delegates** and consist of the President, Vice-President,
113 Secretary, and Past President. The officers of the **Assembly** will comprise the **Assembly**
114 **Executive Board.**

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116 **Section 2.** The President, Vice-President and Secretary shall be elected in accordance with the
117 Bylaws.

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119 **Section 3.** The officers shall fulfill their duties as stipulated in the Bylaws.

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122 **ARTICLE VIII.**
123 **SCHOOL COMMITTEES**

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125 **Section 1.** The standing committees of the SAHP include but are not limited to:

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137 **Section 2.** The standing committees shall formulate and recommend actions and policies for
138 approval by the Faculty **Assembly** and Dean of the SAHP. School Committee membership
139 and function are described in the Bylaws.

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142 **ARTICLE IX.**
143 **AMENDMENTS.**

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145 **Section 1.** The Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of the total votes cast

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by the membership of the **Assembly**. Voting shall be by electronic or written ballot, or some combination thereof. The decision on the type of ballot used shall be determined by the **Delegates**. Confidentiality will be maintained where deemed appropriate. The amendment must be submitted in writing for discussion at a regular meeting of the **Delegates** and approved by the **Delegates** before being submitted to the Assembly for a vote.
