Identification Card

- Your ID should be visibly displayed.
- Helps University Police to quickly identify who belongs on Campus.
- If your ID is lost/stolen replace it immediately.
- Allows access to buildings, walkways and wellness center.
- If you find an ID card turn it into University Police
- DO NOT allow anyone to piggyback with you



Campus Access

- The campus is open to the public Monday - Friday 7:00am - 6:00pm.
- All students, faculty, and staff have 24-hour access to buildings with LSUHSC-NO ID card, through designated entrances.
- Use of Surveillance Cameras- UPD uses a series of cameras to monitor LSUHSC-NO parking lots, garages, the Walkway to Wellness, and all buildings.



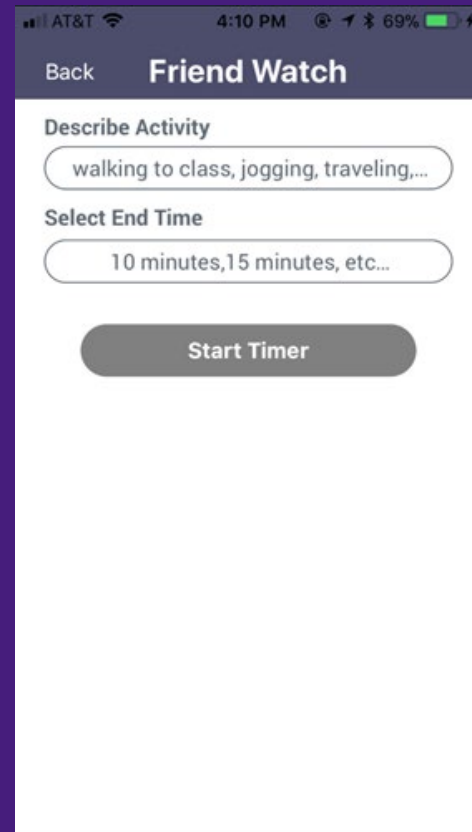

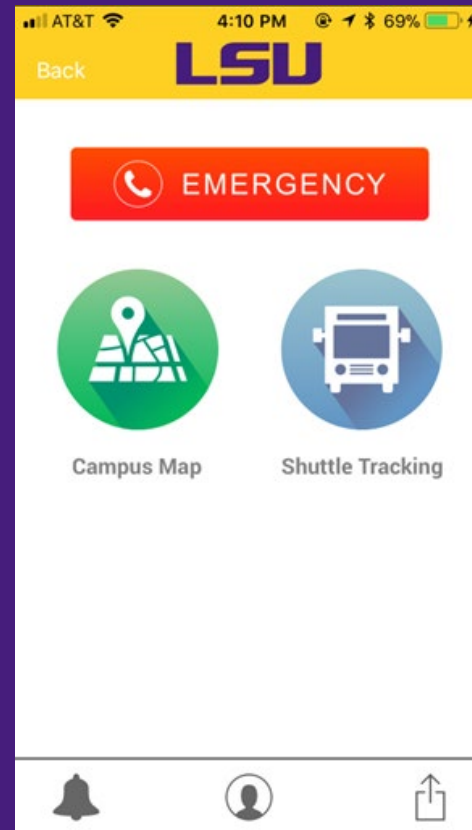
Emergency Response Plans enable you to quickly call up information about how you should respond to an emergency.

The Emergency Response button takes you to plans for different types of emergencies.

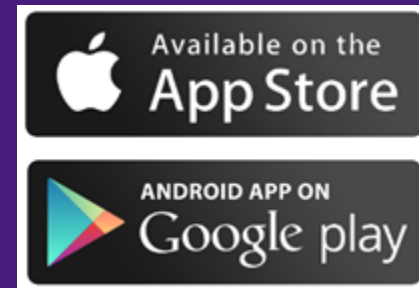

- ***The information on this page summarizes the online parking registration process. Students must still select Parking Fee and Parking Gate Card on Optional Fee Form submitted to Bursar's Office.***
- **Register online by entering our Online Parking Account site with your LSUHSC credentials (username and password). Use the following link and click Log in.**

- **Since you will already be credentialed with the University, click on the Affiliated Login option.**
- **Enter your University Login ID (Username) and Password.**
- **Select Get Permits and options will be listed. Select and add your Student permit and card (if necessary). A gate card is needed for all gated lots. The options for Student parking permits are Student Commuter lots and Residence Hall lot (1900 Perdido Street tenants only). Students moving into the privately run Residences at LSU Health should select the Student Commuter lots option. The next step will be to add your vehicle information and then attach a copy of vehicle registration for verification. Select Delivery Option so that you can pick up at Parking Services prior to Orientation or from your School on Orientation day. . Verify Cart details, select Payment Method (Bursar LSU Student Fees), and click Pay Now. . If for any reason you did not add the parking fees on your Optional Fee form, you can pay parking fees directly by credit card (if you did add the fees on your Optional Fee form, please do not pay by credit card).**


Card and Decal Guide

GATE CARD and PLACEMENT GUIDE



Gate Card (White Box). Mount Card Vertically inside your front windshield at least two inches from the top and side.

Note — Gate Cards may read better in lower positions for higher vehicles such as vans and SUVs. In addition, some luxury vehicles with special windshields or vehicles with a special film/tint on windshield may not allow the gate card to be read.



DECAL (Black box)
Place decal on the left back windshield on the outside.

PARKING RULES SUMMARY

- **Park only in authorized areas at authorized times.**
- **All vehicles must display properly affixed decal or temporary hangtag (i.e. exterior of back left window or left back bumper).**
- **Park forward in all facilities (not backwards)**
- **Do not park in two spaces (i.e. over line in striped facilities).**
- **Do not park in roadways or turning lanes.**
- **Certificate of mobility impairment must be submitted to LSUHSC Parking and “Accessible Parking Hangtags” must be displayed prior to parking in Accessible spaces.**
- **Do Not Park In Patient Area (First Floor Roman Street Garage, Seton Patient lot and Dental School Patient Lot) (unless paying as visitor) or Reserved Spaces.**

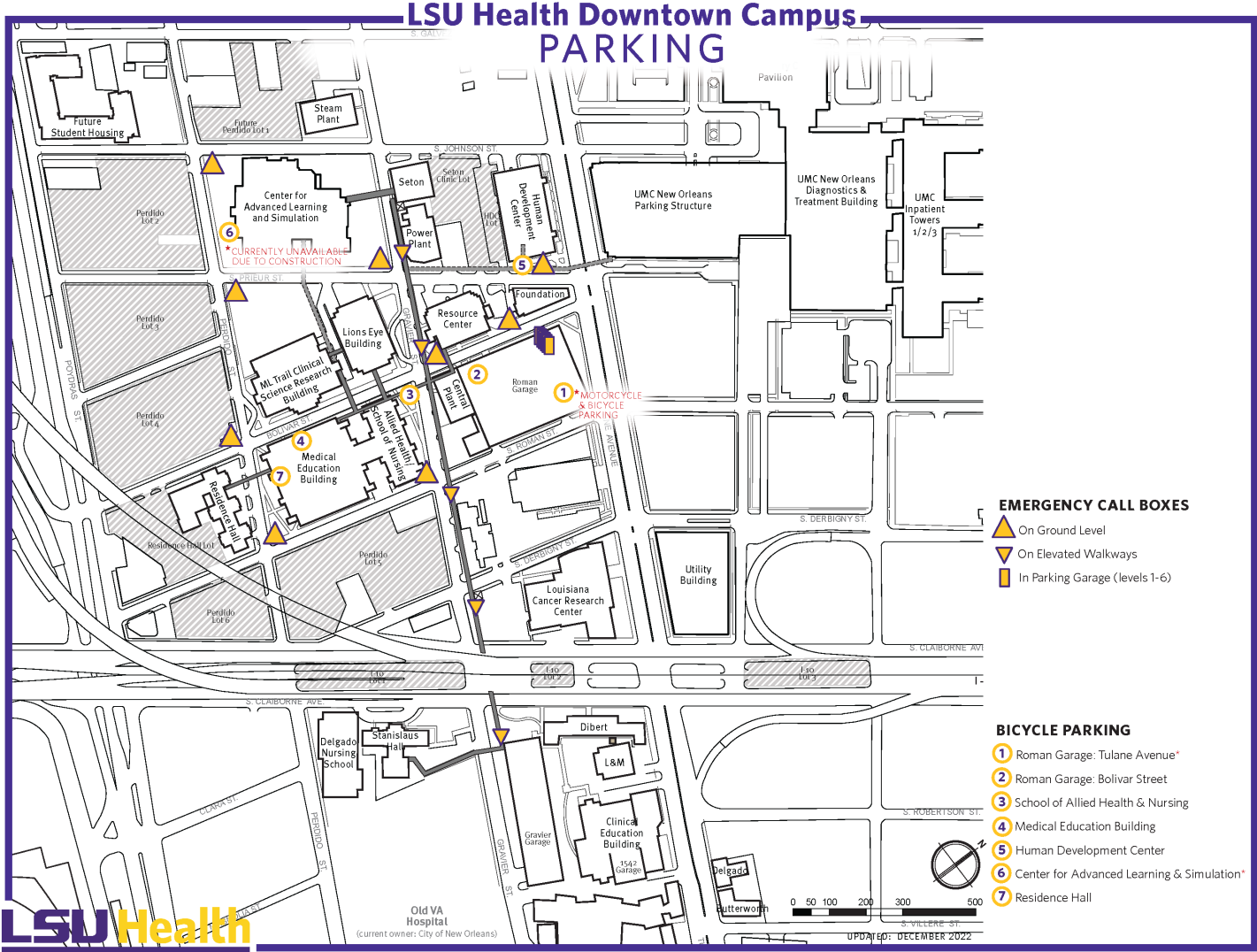

The Residences opened in 2023 and consists of 472 housing units, one (1), two (2) and three (3) bedroom apartments, in addition to individual studio apartments. The Residences at LSU is a public / private partnership and is managed by the Michaels Organization under the auspices of the LSUHSC Foundation, and houses students from accredit medical institutions of higher learning such as
- LSUHSC, Tulane University, Xavier University, Delgado School of Nursing, etc.

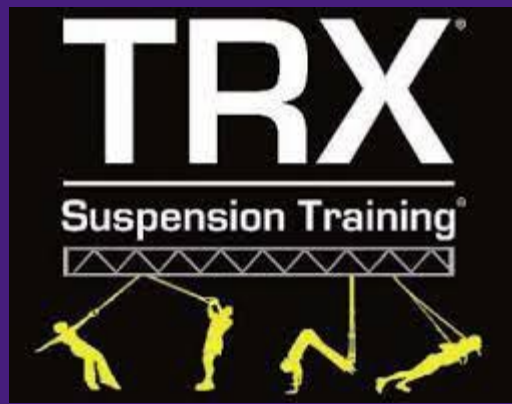

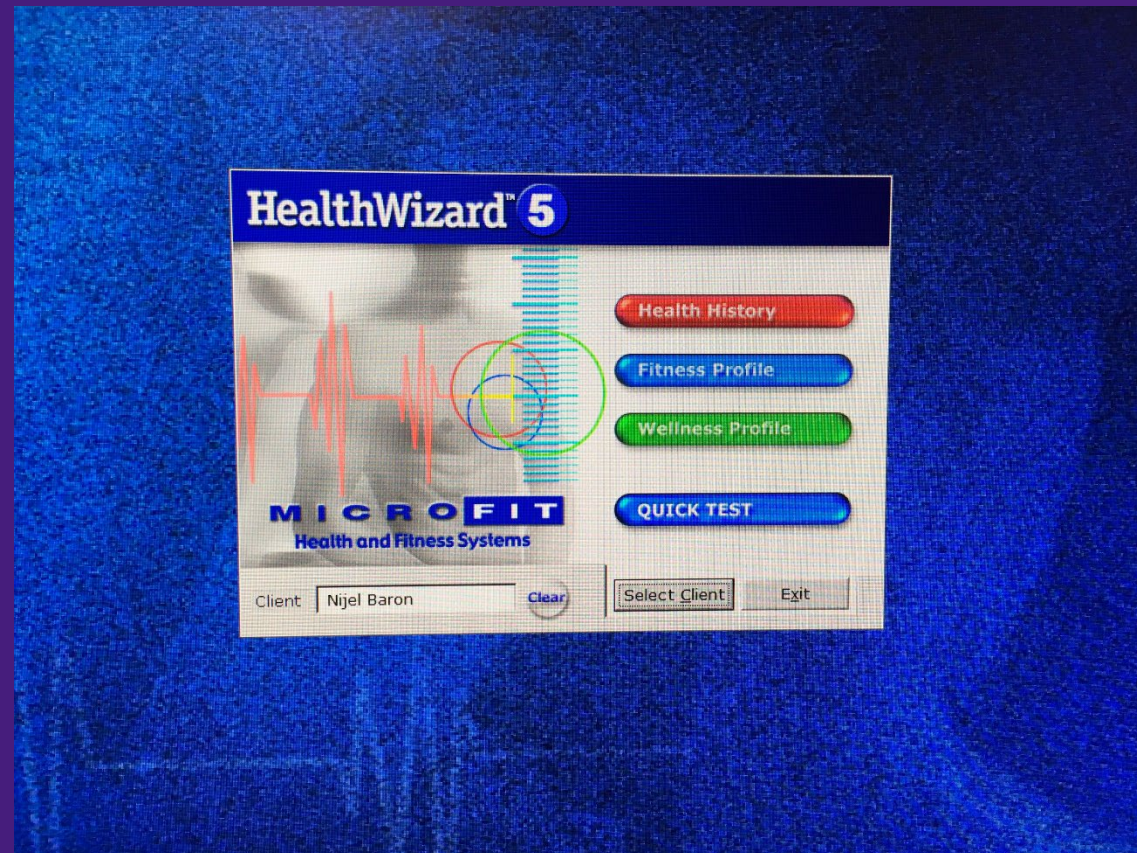

What does ODS do?

- Oversees adherence to ADA/Section 504 & provides classroom accommodations to students
- Ensures equal access to education
- Complies with CM-26 Policy

“No qualified individual with a disability shall, by reason of such disability, be excluded from participation in or be denied the benefits of the services, programs, or activities of a public entity, or be subjected to discrimination by any such entity.”

(Pub. L. 101-336, title II, §202, July 26, 1990, 104 Stat. 337)

ODS Definitions

- **Disability** – Mental or physical impairment that substantially limits one or more major activities
- **Qualified Individual** – A person who is able to perform essential functions and technical standards with or without reasonable accommodations
- **Reasonable Accommodation** – Any change, alteration, or auxiliary aid utilized to perform a task that would not cause undue hardship or a fundamental alteration

Procedures for Requesting Accommodations

1. Student Self-Advocates to ODS
 - Student Intake Form
 - Documentation from Healthcare Professional
2. Intake Meeting/Interactive Process
 - Student meets with Director of ODS
 - Accommodation Plan is Created
 - Accommodation Letter Generated
3. Student Self-Advocates to Faculty
 - Implementation Discussion
4. Accommodation Letters Every Semester

Title IX Overview

- Federal regulation in the Education Amendments Act of 1972

“No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance” (20 U.S.C. § 1681 – 1688)

- Prohibits discrimination based on sex, gender, sexual orientation, and gender identity; also protects pregnant and parenting students
- Protects against sex discrimination, sex-based harassment, and sexual misconduct

Title IX Definitions

- **Sex-Based Harassment**
 - Quid Pro Quo
 - Unwelcome Conduct/Hostile Environment
- **Sexual Misconduct**
 - Stalking
 - Dating Violence
 - Domestic Violence
 - Sexual Assault
- **Complainant** – The person to whom the behavior was directed
- **Respondent** – The person who is said to have conducted the misconduct
- **Supportive Measures** - non-disciplinary, non-punitive individualized services offered as appropriate and reasonably available, regardless of whether a formal complaint has been filed

What is Power-Based Violence?

“Any form of interpersonal violence intended to control or intimidate another person through the assertion of power over the person”

- Outlined in the Board of Regents Uniform Policy on Power-Based Violence/Sexual Misconduct
- NIH/NSF also prohibits this behavior
- Includes harassment, discrimination, bullying, etc.

LSUHSC Cares

- Centralized reporting website
- Used for academic misconduct, nonacademic misconduct, bias/discrimination, Title IX, BIT, and general concerns
 - Description of applicable conduct, responding office, & report forms
- Connection to campus resources

Why Report?

- Improves Learning Environment
- Promotes Culture of Ethical Behavior & Integrity
- Stop, Prevent, Remedy
- Identifies Campus Trends and Determines Solutions

Reporting Options

- Maxient
 - Internal Software
 - Automatic Routing
 - Case Management
- EthicsPoint
 - Anonymous Reporting
 - External Server

Academic Misconduct & Academic Complaint Incident Reports

- Academic Misconduct
 - Cheating, plagiarism, falsification of data, etc.
- Unprofessional Conduct
 - Not following class rules, uniform violations, unresponsiveness, etc.
- Academic Complaints
 - Concerns about school processes, grading, preparedness of faculty, etc.
- Addressed according to School specific processes as outlined in student handbooks
- Routed to Academic or Student Affairs

Nonacademic Misconduct Incident Reports

- Nonacademic Misconduct
 - Conduct beyond unprofessional behavior such as hostile education environment, theft, physical assault, weapons, etc.
 - Behavior that could violate local, state, or federal law
 - Conduct not of an academic nature that could potentially result in suspension or expulsion
- Addressed according to CM-56 procedures
- Routed to the Office of Student Advocacy & Title IX for review

Bias & Discrimination Incident Reports

- Any instance of bias or discrimination based on protected classes/characteristics
 - Age, race, ethnicity, religion, disability, national origin, color, shared ancestry, etc.
 - Microaggressions
- Routed to the Office of Diversity & Inclusion

Title IX & Power-Based Violence Incident Reports

- Title IX:
 - Any conduct that harasses or discriminates on the basis of sex, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, or pregnant/parenting status; sexual harassment or sexual misconduct
- Power-based Violence:
 - Anyone in a position of power uses their power to bully, threaten, harass, intimidate, or humiliate another person
- Routed to the Office of Student Advocacy & Title IX

Individuals of Concern Incident Reports

- Disruptive or concerning behaviors; difficulty accessing resources; academic distress; personal, emotional, and/or psychological difficulties; or potential harm to self or others.
- Routed to the Behavior Intervention Team (BIT)
 - Multidisciplinary team designed to identify and support individuals in distress to reduce the individual's risk, increase safety, and prevent violence

General Concern Incident Reports

- Concerns about any offices or individuals outside of the academic setting, i.e. Office of Financial Aid, Registrar, Title IX, etc.
- Concerns about campus climate
- Also used as a catch-all category if the other forms don't seem to apply to the concern
- Routed to the Office of Student Advocacy & Title IX for review

Confidential Resources

- Office of the Ombuds
 - No Records
 - No Involvement in Formal Processes
- Campus Assistance Program (CAP)
 - Counselor Privileges
 - May be involved in Fitness for Duty evaluations
- All other offices are considered private not confidential

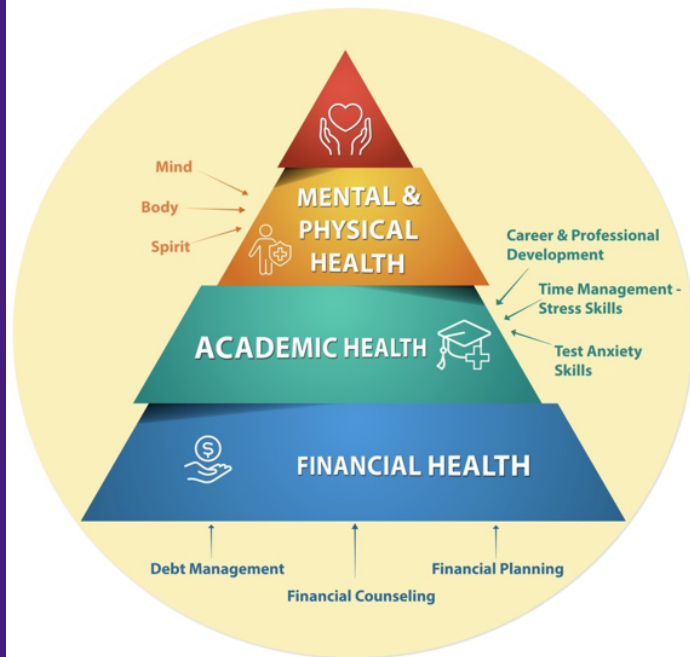
