## *At School*



Third Year Audiology students walked over to the Southeastern Louisiana Veterans Medical Center for a demonstration of rotational chair testing and computerized dynamic posturography! Third Year Sydney and Dr. Mutter acted as our patients for rotary chair so students could see the chair's movements stimulating different frequencies and complete an entire test battery.

Speech-Lanaguage Pathology students tried out an electrolarynx in Voice class today! An electrolarynx is an external vibratory source that moves articulators to shape sounds into words. These devices are used for after surgical healing and can be placed on the soft tissue (no bones!) of the neck, cheek, or submandibular space. No air is needed- how cool!
