ABOUT THE SPEAKERS



George W. Hebert, Ph.D. is a Clinical Associate Professor in the Department of Counseling at the Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center – New Orleans (LSUHSC-NO) and also serves as a faculty member in the Physician Assistant's Program in the Department of Interdisciplinary Human Studies. Previously, Dr. Hebert served nine years as the training coordinator/director for an APA accredited program in School Psychology at the LSU Health Sciences Center in the Human Development Center. Additionally, he had served a total of eight years providing psychological services and directing an outpatient mental health clinic for children and adolescents in Louisiana. He also served a total of six years as a school psychologist in both rural and urban settings in Louisiana. Finally, Dr. Hebert had been a part-time faculty member in the psychology department at the University of New Orleans for many years.

Holly Walters holds a Ph.D. in Counselor Education from Oregon State University. She is a Licensed Professional Counselor Supervisor (LPC-S). Currently, she is an Assistant Professor at LSUHSC in New Orleans. She is an alumna of the program graduating with a Master of Health Sciences in Rehabilitation Counseling. She earned her Bachelor of Science in Psychology from the University of New Orleans.
